- -third person: he, she, Romeo, they, it etc. **NOT** "you", "me", "I think". . .
- -present tense. . . Romeo **loves** Juliet and **pursues** a marriage with her.
- -action verbs
- -formal tone
- -textual evidence/proof
- -Introduce quote, "quote" (Shakespeare lines 20-21).

Genre: play/drama (not "story" or anything else)

5th: Act III: 1044-1048 (line 130)

7th: Act III: 1044-1051 (line 190)
