Negro is not the "N"-word

"...in the 2000 Census, more than 56,000 people wrote in Negro to describe their identity...Some people, it seems, still strongly identify with the term, which used to be a perfectly polite designation."

nigger *noun*

1: NEGRO – usually taken to be offensive

2: a member of any dark skinned race – usually taken to be offensive

3: a member of a socially disadvantaged class of persons
